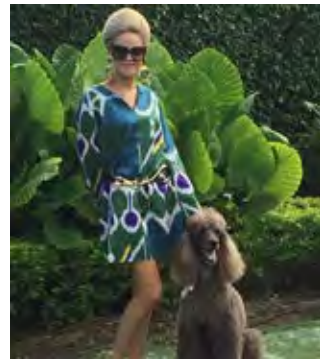

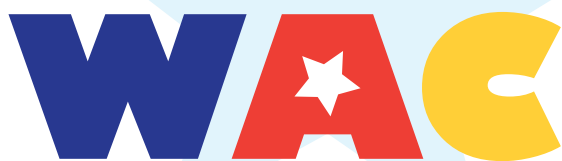

She has been an adjunct professor in numerous universities in psychology, exceptional child education and administration.

Carol Jaeger was Chairman of the Board of the Institute for Human Values and received a commendation from the National Conference of Christians and Jews for her work to establish interfaith councils on college campuses. **Barry University honored Carol Jaeger as a “Distinguished Alumna”**, the Miami-Dade Junior League named her **“A Woman of Distinction”** and the American Red Cross bestowed the J.N. Macarthur Award as a **“Distinguished Educator”**. She was President and Chairman of the Board of the Council for International Visitors, sponsored by the U.S. State Department and served a 4 year appointment to the National Institutes of Health. She resides in the Town of Palm Beach where she is a **Trustee on the Board of the Palm Beach Theater Guild and is Vice Chair of the World Affairs Council of Palm Beach**.

**D**ouglas C. Evans is **President of the Society for the Preservation of the Great American Songbook** and the founder of **Premiere Global Partners**, an international consulting firm dedicated to working with non-profit organizations.
